DPAC notes -

Feb. 14 - 2018

Carl Cooper - DESC held a registration meeting for South Canoe Outdoor Learning Centre on Feb. 1st. 97 students registered, talking about added bussing for students. Sounds like this will be happening - school can hold up to 150 students - so there is still room.

BCTF & BCPSEA re-opened Implementation of and changes to restored languages from Nov. 2016 & an agreement was reached March 3 2017. New renegotiations will begin again after 2018/2019 school year. - New teachers were brought in to classrooms (Denis) is part of our "Remedy" program. Class sizes + Composition will be looked at. Currently - K = max 22; g1-3 = 24 max; g4-12 max 28-30, depending on splits etc.

School District 83 currently has 1000 special needs students, which works out to 900 "remedy hours". SD 83 received \$6 million through this fund.

Kristie's Question: * Carl Cooper & Kari will be looking into, and setting up a support workshop for parents with children who receive designation where an Individual Education Plan (IEP) is put together. This will include - the process of putting an IEP together, Family support tools, & how to navigate through a designation.

- DPAC wants to create & hold a Parent workshop regarding sexting, drugs, & "Over 18" dangers - more info to follow.

Trustee Mike McKay sent a letter to BC Minister of Education on Dec. 19th with a recommendation of 5 trustees on a new board... Should hopefully learn status update by end of this month.

- It is the school district's intention & commitment to get better at communication with parents which takes upfront discussion, patience & time. The new school district websites, as well as individual school websites is expected to be launched this month.
