Fundraiser:

Purdy's chocolate bar fundraiser: Kristen M looked into the details. There is cost up front for us.

- Bars cost .80 cents, First order of \$475 dollars' worth. After that any amount.
- Options are Milk Chocolate, Milk Chocolate with Almonds and Milk Chocolate with crispys
- Plain bar sells for \$2, other bar \$5
- Where and how to sell. At Store, door to door. If parents take a box be aware you are responsible for the cost of the box.
- Keep in mind there will be losses. Theft of bars, product reaches best before date before sold etc.

No Purdy's Easter Chocolates this year. Timing is had with Spring Break. And SCC Association is running it this year.

There was talk on not selling Purdy's Chocolates at all anymore because they had changed the profit margin making it so we made less than previous years with comparable sales. On that note: Purdy's has revamped the profit margin again. It is on a % scale. Lower ranges earning lower %, Higher ranges earning higher %.

There were concerns expressed about the type of fundraisers we run. Uneasy with up buy and sell style. If it doesn't sell well PAC will be out money and stuck with produce. More comfortable with pre order style.
